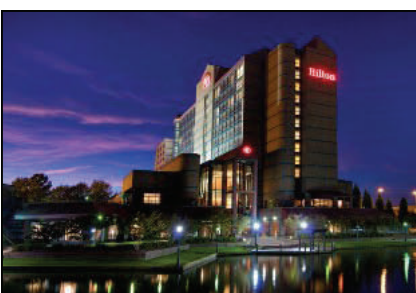
Marcus Engel

History of NCLCA

A task force was formed in 1985 to investigate the development of the Midwest College Learning Center Association. The first conference was held on October 22, 1986. The organization was incorporated in the state of Wisconsin on October 7, 1988, as the Midwest College Learning Center Association, Inc. In 1999, the organization went national, changing its name to the National College Learning Center Association (NCLCA). Today, NCLCA has about 300 members, representing all areas of the United States. Recent conference locations: 2007 – Atlanta, GA; 2008 – Memphis, TN; 2009 - Golden, CO; 2010 - Charlotte, NC; and 2011 - Indianapolis, IN.
